The Fawn Lake Men's Golf (FLMG) program is an integral part of the overall golf program that is overseen by the Fawn Lake Golf Committee. As such, our program is developed within the mission statement and guiding principles of the Fawn Lake Golf Committee outlined below:

Mission statement: To coordinate, organize and oversee all golf related activities of the Fawn Lake Country Club (FLCC) in order to enhance the golf experience of all members and to promote FLCC as the premier golf experience in northern Virginia

Guiding principles:

- Provide our members and guests the best golf experience possible
- Increase FLCC golf member participation in organized events
- Create a fun environment for friendly competition while also maintaining respect for the rules of golf
- Promote respect for all players regardless of their ability
- Support our pro shop staff
- Encourage member "ownership" of helping to maintain the condition of our course
- Increase focus on membership retention and new member development

The Fawn Lake Men's Golf program is open to all Fawn Lake full golf and junior executive members. The goal of the FLMG program is to encourage member participation in both team and individual events over the course of the season, which begins in March and ends in October. The program consists of nine (9) Sweet 16 Saturday events and 10 major events.

THE FAWN LAKE CUP

The Fawn Lake Cup is the coveted trophy awarded to the player demonstrating outstanding performance in both team play (Sweet 16 Saturday events) and individual/team play (major events) over the course of the FLMG golf season. This is not to be confused with the “*Club Champion*” who is the winner of the Club Championship and the ultimate Champion of Fawn Lake Country Club. That event is scheduled for October 1 & 2, 2022.

The winner of the Fawn Lake Cup is the person earning the most Fawn Lake Cup points in all Sweet 16 events, which includes the Sweet 16 Championship, and the 10 major events. Consistent with the Guiding Principles of the Fawn Lake Golf Committee, our overall FLMG Program is structured to encourage participation in both team and individual events. As such, in order for a player to compete for the Fawn Lake Cup, he must participate in at least five (5) Sweet 16 Saturday events and two (2) major events.

The Sweet 16 Saturday events are shown on page 4 and the Fawn Lake Major events are shown on page 11.

For those golfers who are new to the FLMG Program and who may ask what’s the difference between Sweet 16 points and Fawn Lake Cup points – *the difference is nothing*. Players accumulate Fawn Lake Cup points for placing during any of the Saturday Sweet 16 events and for placing in any of the major events. Fawn Lake Cup points are also used to determine who will advance to the Sweet 16 Playoffs. The Fawn Lake Cup is given to the player who accumulates the highest number of Fawn Lake Cup points throughout the season. The more someone plays, the more chances he has to accumulate Fawn Lake Cup points.

Note; Entry fee for each FLMG event is \$30. Payouts to the top teams will be determined based on the number of entries and will be in the form of Pro Shop credits. There will also be prize money awarded (Pro Shop Credits) for Closest to the Pin on all Par Threes. Optional Gross and Net Skins will be available – entry is \$5 for each competition and Skins prizes will be awarded in cash.						

FAWN LAKE MEN'S GOLF SWEET 16 OVERVIEW (Saturday Events):

Saturday Sweet 16 tournaments will normally start at 9:00 a.m., with the exception of the tournaments in March and April which will start later to accommodate the cooler weather. All tournament events will be announced via two emails (Monday and Thursday before the event) to all membership. The schedule will also be available on the Golf Gazette and the FLCC website. Announcements and scorecard handouts will begin about fifteen minutes before the start time at the practice range area.

Sign-up for Saturday events can be accomplished by either signing up in person at the Pro Shop in the tournament book (located at the front desk), or via telephone call to the Pro Shop. Sign-up sheets will be placed in the tournament folder no earlier than 10 days prior to the Saturday event. Participants should confirm their sign up in person at the Pro Shop prior to the sign-up deadline. Upon signing up, each participant must identify the tee box they plan to use on Saturday. **THERE WILL BE NO CHANGES MADE TO THE SCORECARD ON SATURDAY MORNING.** The players' Saturday morning INDEX will be used based on the tee chosen at the time of sign up. If a player does not choose a tee box, one will be chosen using the tee predominately played. We are hopeful this will alleviate late starts so afternoon players have a few extra tee times available.

For Saturday tournaments, the sign-up deadline is 12:00 p.m. on Friday. The Pro Shop will use Golf Genius to set up the teams consisting of an A, B, and C player. We will ensure that everyone who signs up by the deadline will participate in the tournament. This means that some teams may have to use a blind draw.

Gross and Net Skins are available for all Sweet 16 Saturday events. If members wish to participate in the Skins game they must sign up at the Pro Shop before going to the practice facility. No on-range calls will be made for Skins. Entry for Gross Skins is \$5 and for Net Skins is \$5 *in CASH*. ***All Skins winners will be paid in CASH.*** All players competing in the Skins games must hole out.

Each week, the total points for everyone who plays in the Saturday Sweet 16 events will be published on the FLCC Golf Gazette and the FLCC website, so players can see the standings.

Sweet 16 Saturday events are team tournaments (with the exception of the final Sweet 16 playoff tournament which will be individual medal play). Unless otherwise noted, teams will normally be three-man teams formed by a random drawing of A, B, and C players as described above. For the 2022 season, there will be three (3) PICK YOUR OWN TEAM, events. Formats will vary from week to week and selected from the list of format options below.

Members playing in Saturday events will be charged \$30 per event (charged to the member's FLCC account) with the teams being paid out in Pro Shop credits. The number of teams paid will vary according to the total number of members participating in the event. Players will also receive Fawn Lake Cup points depending on where they finish in the event. (See graphics below for Sweet 16 payouts and Fawn Lake Cup point allocation per person based on finishing position). *New for the 2022 season, only those teams finishing in the money positions will receive Fawn Lake Cup Points. Points will no longer be given to teams that do not finish in a paid-out positions of the Saturday events.*

The Sweet 16 playoff will be a one-day event on September 17, 2022. The 16 players with the most Fawn Lake Cup points accumulated during the previous events will be eligible to participate. Those who are tied for points after using their top five (5) of the nine (9) events will also be eligible to participate in the one-day tournament; however, at the conclusion of the tournament, only the top Sweet 16 participants will receive cash awards depending on where they finish in the playoffs. All others, not competing for the Sweet 16 tournament, can still play in the playoff event in order to accumulate Fawn Lake Cup points.

Sweet 16 formats - all three-man teams.

1. Net Stableford - Players play their own ball and all balls count. Scoring is bogey 1, par 2, birdie 3, eagle or better 4. Team with highest point total wins.
2. Modified Stableford - Players play their own ball and all balls count. Scoring is (net) par 1, birdie 2, eagle or better 3. Team with the highest point total wins.
3. Quota (gross) - Each player tries to achieve or better their quota. Player quotas are determined by subtracting appropriate tee handicap from 36 (example: a 15 handicapper would have a quota of 21); players earn points toward their quota as follows: bogey 1, par 2, birdie 4, eagle or better 8. Team that exceeds their team quota by largest amount wins.
4. 1, 2, 3 - All team players play their own ball. On hole 1, 1 best ball net score counts; on hole 2, 2 best net scores count; hole 3, all three net scores count. Continue this rotation throughout the round. Lowest overall team score wins.
5. Two best balls - All team players play their own ball. The two best net scores count on each hole. Team with lowest overall score wins.

6. Two best balls plus – All team players play their own ball. The two best net scores count on each hole; however, if all three players score net birdie or better on a hole then all three scores count. Team with lowest overall score against par wins.
7. Nassau – All cash net score tournament – with approximately 60% of the pot being paid out. The remaining 40% is going to the Sweet 16 pot, Fawn Lake Cup purchase, opening/closing dinners. Cash payouts on front and back nine for teams with lowest net scores. Payout for 18 holes to teams with lowest overall 18-hole scores. Fawn Lake Cup Points awarded only for overall 18-hole results. Tie breaker will be the lowest scores for HC holes 1, 2, 3, and 4. If the tie is not broken add and compare the scores for the remaining handicap holes in succession until the tie is broken.

DETERMINING THE SWEET 16 FIELD:

There will be no make-up dates for Saturday events canceled due to inclement weather, excessive heat or any other reason that would require the course to be closed.

There is no minimum number of Saturday events that a player must play in to be considered for the Sweet 16 Playoff; however, only the points accumulated from the top five (5) Saturday events will be used to determine the players who move to the Sweet 16 Playoff. For example, if a player participates in all nine Saturday events, but accumulates points in only six events, then only the top five of those six events will be used to determine if the player accumulated enough points to compete in the Sweet 16 Playoff. If a player participates in all nine events, but only accumulates points in four (4) events, only those points will be totaled and used to determine his Sweet 16 Playoff eligibility.

It is important to note that regardless of whether or not the player made into Sweet 16 Playoffs, **ALL POINTS** accumulated from **ALL** the Saturday Sweet 16 events he participated in are used to determine the Fawn Lake Cup winner. For example, if a player participates, and earns points, in all nine (9) events, then all of those points will be used for Fawn Lake Cup calculations; however, as described above, only points from his top five events will be used to determine his Sweet 16 standings.

As noted above, all players accumulate Fawn Lake Cup points for any Saturday event they play – regardless of whether they make it to the Sweet 16 playoff event. This means that for those not making it into the Sweet 16 playoff event, but still wishing to play in the playoff there will still be a competition, made up of A, B, C random draw players who will play for Fawn Lake Cup points.

In the event there are multiple players who have the same number of Sweet 16 points following the last of the Saturday Sweet 16 events, those players will be included in the Sweet 16 event, scheduled for September 17, 2021.

FORMATS: There will be one (1) playoff event for all Sweet 16 contestants. If two more players are tied with the same number of points, all will be eligible to participate in the playoff event; however, only the top 16 competitors will receive Sweet 16 money.

BREAKING TIES – In the event of a tie following the playoff round, these procedures are in effect:

1. Low Net on the back nine holes and if still a tie –
2. Low Net on the front nine holes and if still a tie –
3. Low Net on the #1 handicap hole & progress up to the #18 handicap hole.

PRIZE MONEY STRUCTURE: A portion of the \$30 entry fee for Sweet 16 Saturday events is set aside for Sweet 16 prize money, end of season and next season member dinners, trophies, engraving, etc. Therefore, the Golf Committee will determine the Sweet 16 prize money based on several factors; including the total number of players participating over the course of the season and costs of items mentioned above. However, we expect a minimum of \$1,700 will be available for Sweet 16 payouts. A detail example of how the entry fee money collected for each Saturday Sweet 16 event is shown below.

Distribution of Entry Fee Money for Saturday Sweet 16 Events

The following is an example of how the \$30 entry fee for all Saturday Sweet 16 events is distributed. Note that the distribution of money will vary with the number of players participating in the event. Pot percentages below are rounded to equal 100%.

- 24 Players @ \$30 entry fee per player
- 24 X \$30 = \$720 pot
- Prize money 55% of pot (\$390) plus 4 Closest to Pins (\$40) = \$440 (60% of pot) awarded in Pro Shop Credits
- Sweet 16 pot, Fawn Lake Cup purchase, opening/closing dinners – \$290 (40% of pot)

Sweet 16 Playoff Payouts – Example based on 2021 pot of \$1,700:

- 8 players, finishing in 9th–16th place get \$50 each = \$400 (24% of pot)
- 4 players, finishing in 5th–8th place get \$75 each = \$300 (18% of pot)
- Final 4 – Remaining \$1000 (58% of pot distributed among top four)

- 4th Place – \$ 130
- 3rd Place – \$ 210
- 2nd Place – \$ 290
- OVERALL SWEET 16 WINNER – \$370

SWEET 16 PAYOUT CHART

The chart below shows the payout for each Saturday Sweet 16 event. Positions paid are based on the number of players participating. Note that the more players participating increases the number of teams paid. If the number of players participating is below one of the player numbers below divisible by 3 then payouts will default to the previous column of payouts. For example, if 20 players are participating, we will default to the payouts for 18 players.

FAWN LAKE MEN'S GOLF MAJOR EVENTS

The FLMG conducts 15 major events over the season beginning in April and concluding in October. Included in these are 10 major events that earn Fawn Lake Cup Points and 5 events that earn no Fawn Lake Cup points.

The 10 major events earning Fawn Lake Cup points include:

- 5 Match Play events (Championship, Blue, Tournament, White and Green tees); Fawn Lake Cup points are awarded only for a player's best two final four finishes if multiple brackets are played
- Memorial Tournament - two-man best tournament that is dedicated to Fawn Lake golf members that are no longer with us
- Men's Club Championship
- Senior Championship
- Super Senior Championship
- Member/Member

The major events that DO NOT EARN Fawn Lake Cup points include:

- Spring Medal Tournament (Men and Women combined)
- Member/Guest
- President's Cup
- Founder's Cup

Major Events Formats and Procedures

Match Play: Head-to-head play from Championship, Blue, Tournament, White, Green and Gold tees. Players may enter multiple brackets with Pro shop credits awarded to the final four players in each bracket. Fawn Lake Cup Points are awarded only for a player's best two final four finishes if multiple brackets are entered. Any matches tied after 18 holes continues without Handicap Strokes until a winner is decided.

Memorial Tournament: Two-day flighted tournament with two-man teams (create your own or Pro Shop will/can pair) consisting of four (4) nine-hole events: 9 holes alternate shot; 9 holes 1 Best Ball Net; 9 Holes Captain's Choice; 9 holes 2 ball net. Stableford scoring to determine flight winners. Flight winners compete in Modified Alternate Shot Shoot-Out.

Spring Medal Tournament (Men and Women Combined): 36 holes Medal play tournament – flighted with Shoot-Out.

Member/Guest: Two-day flighted tournament with five 9-hole matches for Blue/White tee players. Two-man 1 best ball net for all matches. Flights based on combined team Handicap Index. Flight winners compete in modified alternate shot shoot-out. Handicap in the shootout determined in accordance with the World Handicap System: Rules of Handicapping, Appendix C – Greensomes. Further details below on tie breakers and shootout.

Member/Member: Two-day flighted tournament of two-man teams. One best ball net on Saturday and Sunday. Flights based on combined team Handicap Index. Flight winners compete in modified alternate shot shoot out. Handicap in the shootout determined in accordance with the World Handicap System: Rules of Handicapping, Appendix C – Greensomes. Further details below on tie breakers and shootout.

Presidents Cup: Two-day two-man event from Tournament Tees. Teams must qualify via 1 best ball 18-hole round (marker required). Top 8 qualifying teams are seeded/compete in 4 ball match play on Saturday and Sunday.

Men's Club Championship, Senior Championship and Super Seniors Championship: 36-hole stroke/medal play from designated tees. Low Gross and Low Net winners recognized.

Founder's Cup: 36-hole Ryder Cup event. Each Club Professional drafts a team. Teams play a four-ball format on Saturday at an away course and a 9-hole scramble/individual hole match on Sunday at FLCC. Best team score wins.

Tie breaker and shoot out rules for flighted match play tournaments (Member/Member and Member/Guest)

- Tie Breaker
 1. Compare head-to-head matches
 2. Compare total true number of points each team earned in each of their matches (above 5-point cap). Highest point total wins
 3. Team hole scores for each match will be totaled and compared starting with lowest handicap hole and continued until the tie is broken
- Shootout:
 1. Only flight winners will compete in the shootout. No wild card teams unless participation dictates.
 2. Modified alternate shot on holes 1, 9, 10 and 18
 3. Team handicap determined using the World Handicap System Handicap Allowance chart from Appendix C Greensomes rules (modified alternate shot) whereby low handicap team member gets 60% of his handicap and higher handicap member gets 40% of his handicap. Those results are combined and rounded to the nearest integer to determine team handicap and applied where applicable to shootout holes 1, 9, 10 and 18. If handicaps are equal the shootout handicap will be half of their combined handicaps.
 4. Example:
 - Player one handicap is $7 \times 0.6 = 4.2$
 - Player two handicap is $20 \times 0.4 = 8$
 - Combined team total is 12.2 rounded down to 12 and will receive strokes on holes 1, 10 and 18 but not on hole 9.

Fawn Lake Cup points are determined and awarded based upon where teams finish and the number of participants in each of the ten (10) Sweet 16 Saturday events. For Major Events, points are awarded based on where individuals finish in each of those events (see the spreadsheets below).

FAWN LAKE MEN'S GOLF – FRIDAY EVENING NINE-HOLE EVENTS

Following our guiding principles of promoting and encouraging more participation in organized events, in 2022 the FLMG will have eleven (11) nine-hole Friday evening events. These events will start in April and conclude in September. They are open to any and all Full Golf or Junior Executive Golf members. Normally, tee off times will start at 5:00 pm on Fridays; however, earlier in the season, they will start at 4:30 pm. There are only two (2) nine-hole events per month and normally, they are not held on the Friday before a Saturday Sweet 16 event. **Sign-up for Friday evening events is NLT 12:00 pm Thursday** and can be accomplished by either signing up in person at the Pro Shop in the tournament book (located at the front desk), or via telephone call to the Pro Shop. Sign-up sheets will be placed in the tournament folder no earlier than 10 days prior to the Friday event. Participants should confirm their sign up in person at the Pro Shop prior to the sign-up deadline. Upon signing up, each participant must identify the tee box they plan to use for the Friday event. **THERE WILL BE NO CHANGES MADE TO THE SCORECARD ON FRIDAY EVENING.** The players' Friday evening INDEX will be used based on the tee chosen at the time of sign up. If a player does not choose a tee box, one will be chosen using the tee predominately played.

With the exception of two Friday events, all other events will be individual play. **THERE ARE NO FAWN LAKE CUP POINTS GIVEN FOR ANY FRIDAY NINE-HOLE PLAY.** There is a \$15 per golfer entry fee, for every nine-hole event. All payouts will be in Pro Shop credits.

BREAKING TIES – In the event of a tie following any nine-hole event, these procedures are in effect:

- Low Net on the #1 handicap hole of the particular 9 holes being played & progress up to the highest handicap hole;
- If still tied, Low Gross on the #1 handicap hole of the particular 9 holes being played & progress up to the highest handicap hole;
- If still tied, participants split the pot.

A breakdown of payouts for both the individual play and the two-man team play is listed on the following pages, as are the schedules and formats for the nine-hole events. We expect to pay out approximately 70% of the entry fee, including two \$10 (2) CTP, with the rest of the entry fee going towards the end of year FLMG dinner and awards.
